

## The Warden's Word

I'm writing to you to pass along the encouraging news that the Vestry at its first meeting (January 24) of 2011 passed an operating budget for Calvary Church. As you might be aware the Vestry made it a mandate last year to pass balanced budgets moving forward. I'm happy to say that that objective was accomplished again for 2011 to within a one-half of one percent margin of error.

The operating income for 2011 is budgeted at \$1,590,800 while expenses are budgeted at \$1,598,800. It was not an easy process to arrive at these numbers. I want to take this opportunity to thank everyone involved in this undertaking including our Finance Committee. I want to especially thank our dedicated volunteer treasurer Bob Eley for all of the time and attention he spent in massaging the final budget figures over the last several months.

There are several items that I would like the Parish to know about this year's bottom line. It has been the Vestry's intention to lower the draw on the endowment needed to balance the budget each year until the draw reached the more fiscally responsible level of 5% annually. The Vestry was able to accomplish that goal again for 2011 by reducing the endowment draw from 6.5% to 6.25%. This was not the one half of one percent that was hoped for but it was in fact a reduction. Limiting the reduction in the draw on the endowment to one quarter of one percent helped to enable the Vestry to maintain all 2010 staff positions in 2011.

There were, however, some adjustments which needed to be made to employees' compensation for 2011 in order to balance the budget. Under new legislation passed by Congress at the end of 2010, each staff member was to receive a 2% reduction in their social security withholding amount which would have amounted to an increase in their take home pay. The Vestry decided to keep staff's take home pay (including clergy) the same for 2011. The 2% additional compensation that would have

been received by staff according to the new legislation will go to Calvary instead to help offset the shortfalls in revenue. Also each staff member will be asked to contribute \$50 per month toward his or her individual healthcare plans. Both of these actions will take effect beginning February 1, 2011 and will not be retroactive to January.

A balanced budget also depends upon \$1,020,000 being pledged by Calvary's members and friends in

2011. As of this writing Calvary has received \$950,221 in pledges from 327 households. There remain 70 households which made a pledge in 2010 which we have yet to hear from in 2011. If we receive the dollars pledged last year from these remaining households we will have received a more than sufficient amount to realize a balanced budget. Yes, this is an act of faith but the Vestry feels confident that Calvary's parishioners will respond generously. It should be noted that Calvary came to within \$11,800 (less than one percent of last year's budget) of finishing 2010 in the black. This number is, it should be noted, the same as the difference between what was pledged and what was actually paid last year. The Vestry is striving to do better in 2011.

I know I've thrown a great many numbers at you in this update but I think it's important for our parishioners to know where Calvary stands financially. But I also want to remind parishioners that it's not all about the money. It's about what the money enables Calvary to accomplish each year. Your generosity allows Calvary to provide us all with literally hundreds of worship opportunities each year.

Calvary provides Christian Formation opportunities for parishioners of all ages. Our outreach, welcome, pastoral care, stewardship, arts and architecture and Women of Calvary committees provide many opportunities for Christian growth. Our music program is second to no other house of worship in the area. Many outside groups call Calvary home as they minister to the needs of the community in ways Calvary can not.

So, although I've talked a great deal about dollars, it's in reality the good news of the gospel that these dollars permit Calvary to witness to year round that is at the heart of this or any parish budget. If you have already made your pledge to Calvary, the Rector, the Vestry and I sincerely thank you. If your name does not appear on the following pages in this *Agape* as a 2011 pledging household please consider making a pledge for this year. It is never too late to do so and is needed if we are to reach our pledge objective of \$1,020,000.

As Senior Warden and as a parishioner I give thanks for the mission and ministry that is Calvary Episcopal Church. My prayer is that Calvary can continue to spiritually enrich the lives of the people we have occasion to touch. Calvary has been doing just that since 1855. Our Parish has benefited literally tens of thousands of God's children since our founding. God willing and with your help we will continue God's witness in the world for decades to come.

### Prayers for Each and Every Day – \$14.95

By Sophie Piper; Illustrated by Anne Wilson

There are wise words for every morning and blessings for every evening in this book. There are also prayers for the seasons of the church year, all accompanied by vibrant textured collages.

### The Lion Book of 1000 Prayers for Children – \$16.99

By Lois Rock; Illustrated by Ruth Rivers

Simple illustrations are included in this timeless collection of prayers. They are organized by theme, and an index makes the book easy to browse and use. This is a great resource for all who say prayers with children.

### Praying in Color - Kid's Edition – \$16.99

By Sybil MacBeth

Most children enjoy doodling. Sybil MacBeth takes this interest and shows a simple way to use drawing while praying. The author gives suggestions for shapes and movements that can be included. These simple shapes and colors can be used to design a web of prayer. She also includes "praying on your computer," using the shapes, designs and colors of the drawing program.

## MUSICAL NOTES

On Sunday afternoon, February 20, contralto Susan Shafer and pianist Russell Miller will present a “coffee hour” recital here at the Church, at 1 p.m. (immediately following coffee hour, hosted by the Choir).

All are welcome; the program includes the *Songs of Travel* by Ralph Vaughan Williams, the *Four Serious Songs* of Brahms, and a group of newly-composed lullabies by Calvary’s own John Becker. The program will last about an hour. Susan has been heard many times in various contexts here in the eight years since she and her family joined the parish, so her wonderful voice and musicianship need no introduction. I hope you’ll be able to come for the recital, and encourage your music-loving friends to join you.

Earlier that same day, we will welcome our new Assistant Organist, Bill Gesin. Bill is a music-educator in the Mount Lebanon public schools, and has served for a decade as the Organist of St. Stephen’s, Wilkinsburg, so he is an old hand at Episcopal church music, as well. I am very pleased that he is joining our musical forces, and look forward to working with him in the months and years ahead.

On the following Sunday, February 27, at 5 p.m., the Calvary Choir will be joined by the six musicians of the Pittsburgh Brass Ensemble in a service of Lessons & Carols for Epiphany-tide, with a variety of music celebrating the themes of the Season of Light. The music includes two pieces for eight-part choir and brass by Giovanni Gabrieli, another double-choir motet by Palestrina, pieces by Anglican stalwarts Charles Wood and C.V. Stanford, and a couple of more modern pieces, including an arresting setting of the Beatitudes by the Estonian composer Arvo Pärt. I hope you’ll help us celebrate our unusually long Epiphany season with this special service.

On Sunday, March 20, Bruce Neswick, Organist of the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York City, will direct the choirs in the 11 a.m. Eucharist and at Evensong, finishing out a working weekend that we’re all looking forward to. He’s a marvelous choir-trainer, and from my own enjoyment of singing under him in the past I know our singers will get a great deal out of this time with him. (He’ll also be our host this July, as we return to sing once again at the Cathedral.)

And, looking just a bit further ahead, the Bach *St. John Passion* will be performed at Calvary on Sunday afternoon, March 27, at 2:30, with Chatham Baroque leading a splendid array of early-music specialists under the direction of Pitt *emeritus* professor (and internationally known Bach scholar) Don Franklin. The 1725 version of this famous Passion-setting, seldom heard in modern

performances, will receive its Pittsburgh debut; also notable will be the vocal forces, which, like those used in Bach’s day, will be confined to a double quartet, sharing duties as soloists and chorus. I’m very much looking forward to being part of this performance myself, from the keyboard of our beautiful *continuo* organ. (There is another performance the previous evening, March 26, at Synod Hall—but I know which one I’d recommend attending! Tickets are available at the door, or through ProArts tickets, at 412.394.3353.) There is also a free roundtable discussion of Bach’s Passion, involving members of the Christian-Jewish Dialogue of Pittsburgh, at the Church of the Redeemer on Wednesday evening, March 23.

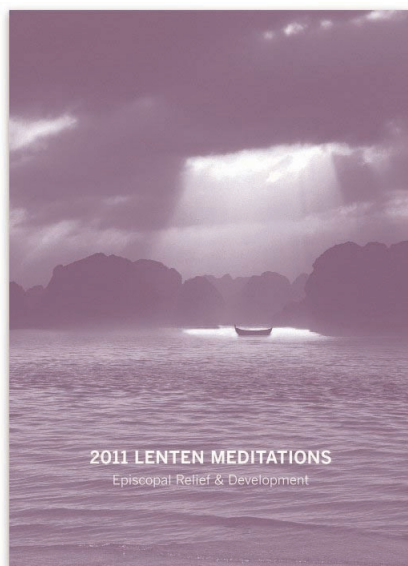
## Soup Group

The WOC recently held its annual planning meeting. The 2011 Steering Committee includes: Deborah Kelly (Coordinator), Peggy O'Rourke (Grants Chair), Susie Prentiss (Bazaar Chair), Margie Muldoon (Hospitality Chair), Michelle Rust (Secretary), Bonnie Keenan and Nancy Kenny (Pack-to-School Co-Chairs), Barbara Scruggs (Liaison to Parish Council), Anne Robb (UTO Chair), Adele Eley (Soup Group), Kathy Garrison (CPC), Jody Clarke Walter and Harriette Carlisle (Advisors), and Karen Godlewski, Sue Jones, and Margaret Ryan (Special Projects).

For those of you who are new to Calvary, we want to emphasize that all female members of Calvary are automatically a member of the Women of Calvary. The Steering Committee represents you in planning and executing the WOC programs/events and always welcomes your input. ## Highlights from WOC annual planning meeting:

❖ **2010 WOC Holiday Bazaar generated a profit of \$21,355.93:** Susie Prentiss and her team held a 2010 wrap-up meeting and began to plan for our 2011 Bazaar, which will be held on November 12. If you would like to get involved with the WOC Bazaar or have ideas for a new table, please contact Susie at 412.361.3346. This is a fun way to meet more women. Plus, giving your time and creative talents will translate into helping women and children.

❖ **2010 WOC Grant Recipients received a total of \$16,000:** Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA), Calvary-Lincoln after School Program (CLASP), East End Cooperative Ministry (EECM), Holy Cross Church, Homeless Children's Education Fund, Gwen's Girls, Lydia's Place, Off the Floor, and the Calvary Clergy Discretionary Funds. (The money to award these grants came from our 2009 Holiday Bazaar proceeds.)

❖ **2011 WOC Grants:** Our successful 2010 Bazaar will fund \$16,000 to \$17,000 in 2011 outreach grants. Each year, some Bazaar proceeds go into a savings account. Thanks to our modest reserves, we now have about \$5,000 for additional grants over the next one to two years. The WOC has a history of using Bazaar proceeds judiciously. Our goals, when donating this money, are to make a difference for women and children and to help Calvary when there is an urgent need. You may recall that several years ago, we gave about \$20,000 to the Calvary Capital Campaign to install the handicap ramp to the

Lady Chapel. This ramp now enables all members and guests, regardless of physical condition, to reach that space.

❖ **2011 Hospitality:** The first Home Eucharist of the year will be held on Wednesday, March 2 at the Shadyside home of Barbara Scruggs. These small gatherings are special and we hope you will join us. Our annual **Spring Soirée** will be held on Wednesday, May 18. This is our biggest annual social event, which draws about 80 women, and begins with a Eucharist. We invite you to join us for fellowship, fun, great food, live music and surprises! Over the years, we've heard that many of you consider this event not only for fellowship, but also as a little "thank you" for your volunteer work throughout the year. Please come and allow us to thank you in person for all that you do for our beloved Calvary Church!

❖ **United Thank Offering:** The spring and fall donations totaled about \$1,100. This money goes into the Diocesan UTO fund. The Episcopal Church Women (ECW) use this money to give grants at the end of each year to regional, national, and international non-profits. Our East End has benefitted from the ECW grants: Pittsburgh's "Off the Floor" received funding last year and the Neighborhood Academy received a grant a few years ago. Please support this wonderful program when we have these collections!

❖ **Church Periodical Club:** You generously donated \$330 in 2010 to this Episcopal institution. Its ministry is to supply books, magazines, tapes, videos, and computer programs free to those who cannot otherwise afford them and it raises the money to do this through annual collections at each Episcopal Church.

❖ **2010 Pack-to-School Program:** You generously donated 100 clothing items, 20 backpacks, a box of school supplies, and \$565 in cash contributions. We will contact Lincoln Elementary School to explore this year's needs before kicking off the 2011 project.

❖ **Soup Group:** This group meets monthly to prepare and freeze delicious soups for those who are house-bound due to any number of issues. Please note all are welcome to take this soup to a friend, family member, or neighbor regardless of whether they are a member of Calvary.
